FINDINGS

1. **AUTHORIZATION:**

D.C. Official Code § 2-303.05(a)(1), 27 DCMR §1702.3

2. **MINIMUM NEED:** The Department of Public Works, Solid Waste Management Administration has an ongoing need for maintenance service and parts for its Bulrite Handler cranes installed at the Benning Road and Ft. Totten Transfer Stations.

3. **ESTIMATED REASONABLE PRICE:**

\$171,424.00

4. **FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT:**

Northshore Manufacturing is the manufacturer of the Bulrite cranes currently in use at the transfer stations. Bulrite is the trade name of Northshore.

Northshore has satisfactorily provided warranty and non-warranty services in the past to the District. Northshore, as the manufacturer, is the only vendor who can provide warranty services and repair parts.

Northshore has recently established a relationship with a local dealer, Mid-Atlantic Waste Systems to provide parts, but fabricated parts would need to be done by Northshore and Northshore would provide repair services.
