1. Authorization:

D.C. Official Code §2-354.04, 27 DCMR 1304, 1700 and 1701

2. Minimum Need

The District of Columbia, Office of Contracting and Procurement, on behalf of the Department of Corrections is seeking a contractor to upgrade its Offender Management System (OMS).

3. Estimated Reasonable Price:

\$250,000.000

4. Facts That Justify Sole Source

The Offender Management System (OMS), is a proprietary jail management software system, owned and produced by Digital Solutions Incorporated (DSI). DSI is the sole vendor that can provide maintenance and upgrade services for OMS.

Offender Management System is the applications backbone for daily DOC operations and mission critical technology, improving processes and providing management information to decision-makers.

OMS also facilitates billing for inmates held within DOC facilities for other jurisdictions/authorities. Some of these categories of inmates include: parole violators, federal program failures, designated felons, U.S. District Court prisoners, etc. The average revenue associated with inmate billing is \$22,000,000.00 annually.

Therefore, there is no other vendor that can provide the required services for DOC's Offender Management System.
