**DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS FOR
SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT**

Agency: Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA)

Contractor: Boys Town of Washington D.C. Inc.

Contract No.: CFSA-10-H1-0005

Captions: Traditional Group Home

1. AUTHORIZATION:

27 DCMR 1702, Section 1702.3, D.C. Official Code §2-303.05(a) (1)

2. MINIMUM NEED:

The Government of the District of Columbia, Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA), has the following minimum need:

A Contractor to provide Traditional Group Home Care, which requires a supervised group home environment for children and youth, aged thirteen (13) to twenty-one (21) with structured daily programming which incorporates a formalized behavior management model, on-site psycho-educational groups, and on-site life and social skill development. The proposed period of performance for the modification to extend Option Year Four (4) shall be January 1, 2016 through May 23, 2016.

3. ESTIMATED FAIR AND REASONABLE COST:

\$346,609.97

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY A SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT:

The Government of the District of Columbia Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA) has a minimum requirement to maintain and support the group home provider who is now currently providing Traditional Group Home services.

Boy's Town of Washington D.C. Inc., is the only entity capable of meeting the District's minimum need during the proposed period of performance because they are familiar with the Traditional Group Home Care services which provides a supervised group home environment for children and youth aged thirteen (13) to twenty-one (21) with structured daily programming which incorporates a formalized behavior management model, on-site psycho-educational groups, and on-site life and social skill development. Traditional Group Home Care shall also facilitate provision of an array of services to include individualized and group counseling; alcohol and substance abuse services; educational and vocational support services; therapeutic recreation; health care services and medication management, either on-site or via external providers. Community connections and transportation services must be facilitated if services are to be provided via subcontract or linkage with external organizations.

Boy's Town of Washington D.C. Inc., has licensed facilities and can continue this service without disruption. It takes approximately forty-five days to complete the licensing process, a timetable that would severely disrupt services and impact children in CFSA's care.

Failure to allow the Provider to continue providing services to the Traditional Group Home for the stated period of time would seriously jeopardize the continuation of necessary governmental functions and may jeopardize the health, safety and welfare of the District's children. A new solicitation is under evaluation but contracts will not be awarded before the current contract expires. This contract needs to continue services until the new contract is put into place for Traditional Group Home Services.

Therefore, it is in the best interest of the District to proceed with this HCA extension period, so as to prevent any disruption of services for CFSA children.
