

**DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS

FINDINGS

1. AUTHORIZATION

D.C. Official Code §2-354.04, 27 DCMR 27 Sections 1304.2, 1305.1 and 1701

2. MINIMUM NEED

The Department of Corrections (DOC) has an immediate need for a contractor to provide continuing, non-interrupted, pre-release, community correctional (halfway houses) services to residents held under authority of any United States or District of Columbia statute, or any other lawful authority entrusted to DOC regarding persons housed in facilities operated, managed, owned/leased and maintained by the District. The services are required until such a time as the DOC completes its new requirement to be awarded through the competitive process. Hope Village, Inc. currently provides these services under one of four competitively awarded contract. The existing contract with Hope Village, Inc. expires June 30, 2013.

Period of Performance will be from July1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

3. ESTIMATED REASONABLE PRICE

The estimated fair and reasonable price for the proposed contract award is Nine Hundred Eighty Two Thousand, One Hundred Forty Two, \$982,142.00 and is based upon option year four (4) pricing for the current contract with Hope Village, Inc.

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT

1. There is a continual need for pre-release, community correctional (halfway houses) services.

2. The interruption of these critical/vital services could endanger the safety and welfare of the District residents and general District public at large.
3. Hope Village, Inc. is currently one of four incumbents contracted to provide these services and, per agency representatives Contact Administrators (CA) has performed the services in a satisfactory manner over the past five (5) years.
4. The Sole Source Contract award of the pre-release, community correctional (halfway houses) services would create continuity and the DOC would avoid any interruption in services while the agency develops new requirements.
5. The incumbent's price for the services during the proposed awarded period remain the same as the established fixed unit rates awarded under option year four (4). The District shall experience no increase in cost.
6. The award of these critical services to Hope Village, Inc. is in the best interest of the District.
