

**DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS
FOR A
SINGLE AVAILABLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT**

1. AUTHORIZATION:

D.C. Official Code §2-354.04; 27 DCMR 1304, 1700, 1701

2. MINIMUM NEED:

The Department on Disability Services (DDS), Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA), requires the services of an approved Provider under the District's Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services Waiver for Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD to render occupancy-related residential expenses and services.

The period of performance shall be from date of award through September 30, 2016.

3. ESTIMATED REASONABLE PRICE:

The estimated fair and reasonable price is \$13,966.82.

4. FACTS WHICH JUSTIFY A SINGLE AVAILABLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT:

A. A person-driven system affords people with disabilities the opportunity to decide where and with whom they live, to have control over the services they receive and who provides the services, to work and earn money, and to include friends and supports to help them participate in community life. The person along with family/guardians take their time to meet and interview with various Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services Waiver approved providers before making a decision as to which provider it chooses to provide residential services.

B. Under the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), The 1915(c) waivers are one of many options available to allow the provision of long term care services in home

and community based settings under the Medicaid Program. Waivers are vehicles used to test new or existing ways to deliver and pay for health care services in Medicaid

- C. CMS is working in partnership with states, consumers and advocates, providers and other stakeholders to create a sustainable, person-driven long-term support system in which people with disabilities have choice, control and access to a full array of quality services that assure optimal outcomes, such as independence, health and quality of life.
- D. A notice of intent to award a Single Available Source contract was posted to the OCP website, www.ocp.dc.gov on March 14, 2016. No responses or objections were received within the ten-day period or to this date.
