Question 1: During our walk-through, it was mentioned that service can be rendered in the cell blocks while inmates are present, while accompanied by a guard, but rodent control outside in the yard had to be rendered in the early morning before the inmates have access to the yard. Please clarify accessibility for these service areas and any other areas that may present scheduling challenges. Multiple services visits to the facility for different areas present scheduling challenges and will impact pricing.

yard is generally Access for treatment for the rec-yard is generally made easier when inmates are not present. Controlled bait traps that contain active poisons that are commonly used outside the inmate access areas are not allowed in the yard at any time; this applies to any area within the facility where inmates have regular access such as the housing units within the cell blocks. Your treatment plan must clearly outline your plan of action in these areas. The DOC can accommodate your schedule in most cases. As a final note the DOC will attempt to meet your scheduling requirements within reason concerning your treatment process and times.

Question 2:

During our discussions on January 4th, it was mentioned that service areas for the facilities would be revised and distributed to potential contractors. Can that information list possible service times for each area and facility?

Response:

DOC is a 24/7 operation this will allow for a wide variety of specialized treatments that may be required as well as your routine treatments. The preferred treatment times would be Monday through Friday between the hours of 6am -5pm. Again DOC will attempt to meet your scheduling requirements via your proposal. It's important to realize this is a DOC health safety requirement that is vital to the safe keeping and housing of inmate population as well as employees; therefore DOC will remain accommodating as day to day security will allow.

Question 3:

Are there any restrictions on what technicians can carry into the facilities, such as flashlights, screwdrivers, etc?

Response:

Yes, technicians may only bring in the necessary equipment and tools to carry out their treatment plan as submitted. Such items shall be maintained on a tool and equipment inventory list that shall accompany them each time they enter the facility. There are a large amount of items that are not allowed in the facility such as knives, weapons, cell phones, cigarettes, cigarette lighters, etc. and items of the like.

Question 4:

At OHYC, how does the technician access the main facility? Does he drive his vehicle through the gates like we did during the walk-through or does he park in the parking lot and walk through the gate house carrying his supplies?

Response:

At OHYC, the technician access the main facility through the front security gate at Oak Hill and Contractor vehicle can come on grounds.
