

<p>This addendum is issued to respond to a prospective offeror's question. No other questions will be considered after the effective date of this addendum.</p> <p>Question: With uncertainties of the business model, there would be a net loss that could very well exceed the loaded salary costs equipment purchases. Although the solicitation provides for additional payments from the District to cover the shortfall, it seems that the District would have to in fact cover all associated salary costs, facility/business insurance and wear and tear on the rental fleet before it even made sense for an independent operator to run the facility. There are many hidden costs such as staff training, tools & tool loss, management oversight, product (bikes) replacement and associated theft/breakage that aren't factored and will be a real cost to the operator but hard to quantify. Just based on a back of napkin calculation it seems to me that the Districts' contribution would have to be \$310K - \$325K range. Is this even close to reasonable?</p> <p>Response: The contractor should include in his price proposal all conceivable reasonable costs and income. The proposals will be evaluated as described in the RFP.</p>
