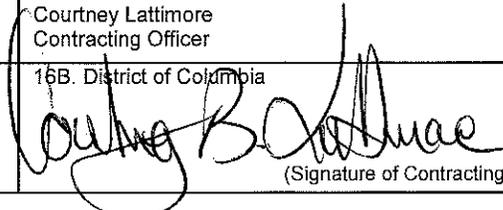

## **75. BOLLARDS, Pay Item 611 086**

### **GENERAL:**

Work under this item includes fabricating, furnishing and complete installation of steel pipe bollards, at locations as shown on the plans. Bollards within sidewalk or islands shall have 30" reveal.

Bollards shall be double extra strong steel pipe, with rounded cap and ornamentation as shown on contract plans. Bollards shall be embedded in footings, as shown on the contract plans.

Finish shall be smooth with powder coated semi-gloss finish.

### **MATERIALS:**

Pipe – Double Extra Strong Steel Pipe as per ASTM A 53, in size and dimensions as shown on the contract plans.

Ornamentation – Lower schedule, larger diameter Steel Pipe as per ASTM A 53 that will be cut and welded – to the double extra strong pipe produce the bollard ornamentation as indicated on the contract plans.

Concrete – 703

Reinforcing steel – 704

Finish – Powder coated semi-gloss

### **SUBMITTALS:**

- (1) Shop drawings, including materials, dimensions, tolerances, welding, hardware, finishes and accessories
- (2) Manufacturer's standard color samples
- (3) Calculations verifying system strengths

### **DELIVERY, HANDLING AND STORAGE:**
