The body of each wage determination lists the classification
and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the
cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage
determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical
order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular
rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local),
a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate
(weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed
in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or
"UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were
prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example:
PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of
the union which prevailed in the survey for this
classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198
indicates the local union number or district council number
where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number,
005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing
the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the
most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1,
2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate
changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing
this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that
no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and
the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average
rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that

classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

19. INSURANCE

This Special Provision supplements 107.13 of the Standard Specifications.

All policies and certificates shall be sent to the Contracting Officer, Office of Contracting and Procurement, District Department of Transportation; 55 M Street, S.E., 4th Floor Washington, D.C. 20003.

The insured shall pay the District the full value for all damages to the lands or other property of the United States caused by him or by his employees, contractors, or employees of the contractors.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS. The Contractor shall procure and maintain, during the entire period of performance under this contract, the types of insurance specified below. The Contractor shall submit a Certificate of Insurance giving evidence of the required coverage either before or after contract award but before work commences. All insurance shall be written with financially responsible companies authorized to do business in the District of Columbia or in the jurisdiction where the work is to be performed; have either an A.M. Best Company rating of A-VIII or higher, a Standard & Poor's rating of AA or higher, or a Moody's rating of Aa2 or higher. The Contractor shall require all subcontractors to carry the insurance required herein, or the Contractor may, at its option, provide the coverage for any or all subcontractors, and if so, the evidence of insurance submitted shall so stipulate. All policies (excluding Workers' Compensation and Professional Liability, if applicable) shall name the District as an additional insured with respect to work or services performed under the Contract. All policies shall provide that the insurance coverage provided hereunder will be primary and noncontributory with any other applicable insurance. All policies shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the District of Columbia. In no event shall work be performed until the required Certificates of Insurance signed by an authorized representative of the insurer(s) has been furnished. All policies shall provide that the Contracting Officer shall be given thirty (30) days prior written notice via certified mail in the event coverage is substantially changed, canceled or not renewed.

1. Certificate of Insurance Requirement. The policy description on the Certificate of Insurance form shall include the District as an additional insured and a waiver of subrogation in favor of the District.
2. Commercial General Liability Insurance. The Contractor shall provide evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer with respect to the operations performed that it carries \$2,000,000 per occurrence limits; \$4,000,000 per aggregate limits; and includes coverage for products and completed operations and personal and advertising injury. The policy coverage shall be primary and non-contributory, shall contain the CGL 2503 per project endorsement.

Commercial General Liability Insurance. If the Contractor is providing insurance for a subcontractor, the Contractor shall provide evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer with respect to the operations performed that it carries \$2,000,000 per occurrence limits;

\$4,000,000 per aggregate limits; and includes coverage for products and completed operations and personal and advertising injury. The policy coverage shall be primary and non-contributory, shall contain the CGL 2503 per project endorsement.

3. Automobile Liability Insurance. The Contractor shall provide automobile liability insurance to cover all owned, hired or non-owned motor vehicles used in conjunction with the performance of the contract. The policy shall cover the operations performed under the contract with a \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage. The policy coverage shall be primary and non-contributory.
4. Workers' Compensation Insurance. The Contractor shall provide Workers' Compensation insurance in accordance with the statutory mandates of the District of Columbia or the jurisdiction in which the contract is performed.
5. Employer's Liability Insurance. The Contractor shall provide employer's liability insurance as follows: \$1,000,000 per accident for injury; \$1,000,000 per employee for disease; and \$1,000,000 for policy disease limit.
6. Umbrella or Excess Liability Insurance. The Contractor shall provide umbrella or excess liability insurance as follows: \$2,000,000 per occurrence; follow form.
7. Railroad Protective Liability Insurance. [If any services provided under or pursuant to this contract involve Contractor doing work near any railroad right-of-way (within 50 feet of a railroad (Metro, Amtrak, MARC, CSX)] Contractor shall provide Railroad Protective Liability Insurance which shall name the applicable railroad(s) as first Insured and the District as an Additional Insured with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence and \$6,000,000 annual aggregate or such other limits as may be required by the railroad(s), whichever are higher, and written on a combined bodily injury/property damage basis including coverage or physical damage to the railroad's property.
8. Contractor's Pollution Legal Liability Coverage. The Contractor shall provide pollution legal liability coverage for the Project. The limit of liability per occurrence shall be not less than \$1,000,000 and the total project aggregate shall not be less than be \$2,000,000.

The Contractor shall maintain this insurance for five (5) years following the District's final acceptance of the work. The policy shall cover the Contractor and its subcontractors of every tier, and shall identify the District as the Project Owner on the policy.

DURATION. Except as proved in I.5.A.6, the Contractor shall carry all insurance until all contract work is accepted by the District. Each insurance policy shall contain a binding endorsement that: The insurer agrees that the Contracting Officer shall be given thirty (30) days prior written notice via certified mail in the event coverage is substantially changed, canceled or not renewed.

CONTRACTOR'S PROPERTY. Contractors and subcontractor are solely responsible for any loss or damage to their personal property, including owned and leased equipment, whether such

equipment is located at a project site or “in transit”. This includes Contractor tools and equipment, scaffolding and temporary structures, and rented machinery, storage sheds or trailers placed on the project site.

MEASURE OF PAYMENT. The District shall not make any separate measure or payment for the cost of insurance and bonds. The Contractor shall include all of the costs of insurance and bonds in the contract price.
