

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14. Description of Amendment/Modification (Organized by UCF Section headings, including solicitation/contract subject matter where feasible).

QUESTION: What are the criteria used by CFSA to select the students who will participate in the Pre-College Program?

RESPONSE: All youth in the 11th and 12th grade are eligible for referral to the Pre-College Program.

RESPONSE: Youth who are in care and in College are eligible for referral for College Retention supports.

Q02
QUESTION: What minimum achievement levels does CFSA require of the student participants before enrolling in the Pre-College program?

RESPONSE: CFSA wants the contractor to be able to explore college with all youth who are eligible and are interested in going to college, therefore there are no minimum achievement levels with the exception of youth who are defined as developmentally disabled. These youth will be provided support through other contractors.

QUESTION: What are the ages of the students? Will there be equal cohorts across that grade span, i.e. 40 9th graders, 40 10th graders, etc?

RESPONSE: Only Youth who are in the 11th and 12th grade will be eligible for referrals to The Pre-College Program.

RESPONSE: Youth who are in care and in College are eligible for referral for College Retention.

RESPONSE: We anticipate that OYE will refer youth in any of the above categories as follows:

- 40 youth in month 1
- 40 youth in month 2
- 40 youth in month 3
- 40 youth in month 4

QUESTION: Can we begin the program with students transitioning from 8th to 9th grade?

RESPONSE: Only Youth who are in the 11th and 12th grade will be eligible for referrals to the Pre-College Program.

RESPONSE: Youth who are in care and in College are eligible for referral for College Retention.

Q04
QUESTION: Do you anticipate that students would matriculate through the program, beginning in grade 9 and remaining through the age of 18 and 21, College graduation? Will there be an expectation that Students will continue to receive services while they attend College?

RESPONSE: Only Youth who are in the 11th and 12th grade will be eligible for referrals to the Pre-College Program.

RESPONSE: The population will matriculate through the program and continue to receive services while they attend College through the age of 21.

QUESTION: How many students of the projected total population of 150 will be enrolled in the program at one time? Or will there be 150 students in the program during each of the contract years?

RESPONSE: CFSA cannot guarantee any specific minimum number of students in any given contract year. However, CFSA anticipates that approximately hundred and fifty (150) students will receive services during each of the contract years providing the contract continues yearly.

QUESTION: Who (contractor or CFSA) will be responsible for facilitating the relationship between the contractor/ Program and the universities?

RESPONSE: The contractor will be responsible for facilitating the relationship between the program and Universities.

Q06a

QUESTION: Will the residency be a 5 day or 7 day per week program? Does a single cohort remain on campus for the full 4-6 week program or do multiple cohorts attend throughout the 4-6 week period?

RESPONSE: Multiple cohorts can occur throughout the 4-6 week period. For example, the contractor could have 4 cohorts occurring at 7 day increments. This will allow the contractor to identify cohorts to occur at more than one university.

QUESTION: Will the contractor be responsible for acquiring all technology (hardware, software, internet, other) necessary to implement the program?

RESPONSE: Yes, the contractor will be responsible for acquiring all technology necessary to implement the program.

Q08

QUESTION: Is the contractor responsible for costs associated with transporting student?

RESPONSE: Youth in care do have access to public transportation through their board rates. However, there may be times when additional transportation needs arise. These incidents should first be discussed with The case-carrying social worker to determine a solution. It is recommended that the vendor budget for some transportation cost.

QUESTION: What is the expected adult to student ration?

RESPONSE: The contractor should make the determination on adult to student ration based on previous experience and knowledge.

Q10

QUESTION: The solicitation reference "college of their (youth) choice" – should we budget for travel to universities that may be out of state?

RESPONSE: The contractor can factor travel to universities that may be out of state, however the contractor is strongly encouraged to utilize local entities that sponsors college tours to support this component of the contract.

RESPONSE: In addition, CFSA hosts college tours. The contractor can utilize the resource to offer to the population being served.

QUESTION: Of the 150 youth proposed for this RFP

- How many are currently in 9th through 12th grade?
- How many are currently in college?
- Of those in college, how many are within 25 miles of the District of Columbia (local)
- Of those in college how many are outside of 25 miles of the District of Columbia (away)




