1. Can the agency elaborate on if the desired applications should be a desktop application or a web-enabled application?

*Answer Q1: The IMS/AFRS applications should be web-enabled so that MPD members can access the systems from an MDT or any desktop with MPD Intranet access. This will also enable MPD to make updates without having to "touch" every PC/MDT.*

2. Section C.1, Page 4, "All requests for service". Does this include even when a report number is not generated? If so, how is the information entered into the IMS/FBR module? Is it coming from CAD?

*Answer Q2: A "request for service" in this context could include a call for service from the 911/311 Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) system as well as other event information initiated by an MPD member. Most field reports are tracked using the CCN number from CAD; however, there will be instances, such as homicide and sexual assault investigations, where a CCN has not yet been generated but the member will want to begin recording information into the AFRS/IMS. In those instances, the system will need to allow for a placeholder in the CCN field and/or the system will need to generate a separate tracking number. In fact, many of our investigative cases are already identified by a CCN as well as a separate unit number, currently generated by the detectives.*

3. Section C.4.7, Page 5, "The IMS must integrate with computer-aided dispatch systems (e.g., Intergraph CAD, Motorola)". Is the CAD integration bidirectional?

*Answer Q3: No, MPD only uses one CAD system: an Intergraph CAD system implemented in December 1999. The new system will need to integrate with I/CAD Link.*

4. Section C.4.8, Page 5, "The IMS must support a unique identifier for each person". Is the unique identifier for persons coming from RMS or generated by IMS/AFRS?

*Answer Q4: The unique identifier being referred to pertains to the unique identifier for each person in the master name file—one of the future master indexes to be built within the RMS but populated by data entered via the AFRS.*

5. Attachment A, Requirement #5 states "Display examples of narratives (or synopses) for various types of events". Is this the same as having templates for different events?

*Answer Q5: Yes. For example, we envisioned having narrative templates constructed for drug cases, burglary cases, etc., to make it easier for a member to submit an accurate and complete narrative.*

6. Attachment A, Requirement #7 states "Include a zip code for all addresses entered within any report". Is the zip code field auto populated? For example, if the user enters 123 Main Street, Washington, DC does the system then apply the correct zip code?

*Answer Q6: Yes, the application should auto-populate the zip code based on the address.*

7. Attachment A, Requirement # 9 states “Mug shots of the offender(s), arrest location, and suspect(s) residence should also be defaulted to the report as appropriate”. From which agency and application(s) are these mug shots and associated data coming?

*Answer Q7: MPD has several applications related to arrests: a Motorola Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS), a related MugShot system and the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS), which is the booking application for most agencies in the District of Columbia.*

8. Attachment A, Requirement #10, “Allow officers to enter a UCR- and NIBRS- compliant incident/offense report in a way that is seamless and hidden to the member”. Can the system prompt the user to change noncompliant report information? For example, if the user enters the Victim Type as being a Business, but does not enter an address. Can the system prompt the user to enter the address as per NIBRS rules?

*Answer Q8: Yes, we are hoping to incorporate logic to improve the accuracy of data collected for UCR and (future) NIBRS. Which fields are considered mandatory and how the logic is built to minimize frustration to the member will be decided during the design phase of the project.*

9. Attachment A, Requirement #25 “Assign a unique sequential number for each supplemental investigative report. This shall be linked to the original incident report.” Is this number visible to the user or simply tracked in the database?

*Answer Q9: The supplemental report number should be visible to the user.*

10. Attachment A, Requirement #39, “Allow ability to restrict access to the notes file to the reporting officer and to the original author (e.g. assisting officers)”. Is this requirement meant to describe a messaging between users? Please elaborate/clarify.

*Answer Q10: This requirement means that only those officers working on the original report (the reporting officer and other officers on the scene) should be able to add notes to the initial record.*

11. Attachment A, Requirement #108, “Allow the application administrator or other authorized user to determine which reports or forms must be reviewed and approved by a supervisor prior to being committed to the database”. Does this mean that all reports must be approved before being saved in the database?

*Answer Q11: No, when a member creates a report, it is immediately saved. However, until the approved flag is set, the report is not considered “official”.*

12. Attachment A, Requirement #138, "Include master location indices with the ability to identify residences, shelters, halfway houses, drug/correction locations etc." "Include master location indices..." Will the geofile be made available at time of development or will addresses be validated in CAD?

*Answer Q12: MPD does use a couple of different geofiles: one maintained by our crime analysis section and another Master Address Repository (MAR) maintained by the District Office of the Chief Technology Officer (OCTO) and District Department of Transportation (DDOT). Both of these will be made available to the vendor chosen for this contract. The Intergraph CAD system actually uses a different geomap, so MDP will not be validating its addresses against CAD.*

13. Attachment A, Requirement #141, "UCR/NIBRS Reporting". Will this function not be performed by the RMS?

*Answer Q13: The RMS will be doing the reporting, but the AFRS needs to be designed to support the appropriate counting and classification of incoming cases to ensure accuracy in that reporting ("appropriate" meaning that the system supports the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI's) UCR guidelines and practices).*

14. Attachment B, Requirement #2 states, "The field reporting module must present the same user interface as the desktop client for RMS". Who is the RMS vendor?

*Answer Q14: MPD does not have an RMS vendor. However, in 2007, the Department built an in-house Incident Management System (IMS) that will form the foundation of the future RMS.*

15. Attachment B, Requirement # 22, 23, and 24, "General Mobile Requirements". Are these not considered hardware requirements?

*Answer Q15: MPD has seen instances where a software application supported similar features.*

16. Attachment B, Requirement #38 states, "The proposed mobile client shall allow the user to upload a partial or complete report to the RMS server at any time". How is this possible if the AFR/IMS is going to be tracking UCR/NIBRS statistics?

*Answer Q16: The RMS should be able to store "preliminary" versions of a report before it is considered "official" for UCR reporting.*

17. Re C.3.5. – is the MPD expecting the vendor's warranty to be renewed in the option periods, or is the option period warranty applicable only to development activities during the option period?

*Answer Q17: the option period is applicable only to development activities. Even if there is no other development, the expectation is that the application's warranty would extend another 12 months after installation.*

18. Re paragraphs C.3.3., C3.4., and section 1.5. (specifically I.5.5., I.5.6., I.5.8., I.5.10, I.5.12.) Please clarify who will own the software developed under the contract? Who will have rights to use the software developed under the contract? Does the District expect to own the source code of any COTS application(s) provided under the contract? Can the vendor satisfy Section 1.5 by depositing the source code in escrow but retaining ownership of the source code, and giving the District licensing rights as described in I.5.6.?

*Answer Q18: MPD will own the software developed under the contract. MPD and its partner law enforcement agencies (upon entering into a Memorandum of Agreement with MPD) will have rights to use the software under the contract. MPD expects to own the source code of any customized development built under the contract. Yes, the vendor can satisfy Section 1.5 by depositing the source code in escrow but retaining ownership of the source code, and giving the District licensing rights as described in I.5.6.*

19. Please describe the desired relationship between the Incident Management System (Solicitation #DCTO-2008-R-0157) and the Records Management System (Solicitation # DCTO-2008-R-0259). Is it envisioned that the Incident Management System will be an integrated module within the Records Management System identified in Solicitation #DCTO-2008-R-0157? Are these two systems – IMS and RMS – envisioned to be the same system?

*Answer Q19: Right now, the "Incident Management System (IMS)" refers to the database that was built by MPD in CY 2007 to support just the entry of the offense and incident data. In the future, the term "Incident Management System" will represent the larger Records Management System (RMS) and will include the arrest and booking, case management, traffic crash and several other modules.*

20. C.4.2, C.5.4 – Please provide copies of MPD's standard business operations forms that are referenced in this section of the RFP.

*Answer Q20: MPD has identified most, but not all, of the forms that will be supported by these applications. A sample of these is attached in Appendix 1.*

21. C.4.5, C.5.7 – This section states, “The IMS must adhere to the MPD RMS Schema”. Please provide documentation regarding this schema so compliance can be assessed.

*Answer Q21: Attached is a diagram depicting the high-level architecture of the future RMS, including details on all its separate components (Appendix 2). It includes information on how the AFRS will feed the RMS and how the RMS will populate the Data Warehouse. Also attached is a diagram that shows MPD’s current interfaces to its partner agencies (Appendix 3).*

22. C.4.6, C.5.8 – Please provide the specifications of MPD’s mobile laptops.

*Answer Q22: The following are the specs for the MDTs:*

23. C.4.7, C.5.9 – This section references integration with CAD. Does the MPD have an Intergraph CAD and a Motorola CAD, as referenced in this section? Are two CAD interfaces required?

*Answer Q23: See answer to Q3 above.*

24. C.4.11 – Does MPD adhere to Federal NIBRS standards or Virginia (VIBRS) standards?

*Answer Q24: MPD's PD Form 251 (Incident-Based Offense Report) is NIBRS-compliant per federal NIBRS guidelines; however, MPD does not yet report NIBRS to the FBI. MPD wishes to ensure that all new applications support NIBRS reporting to accomplish this goal as an agency in the future.*

25. C.5.17 – Is it envisioned the AFRS will send data to the Incident Management System and the RMS (Solicitation # DCTO-2008-R-0259)?

*Answer Q25: Yes, although again, Solicitation #DCTO-2008-R-0259 pertains not to the development of a system but to the hiring of personnel to implement and deploy the RMS.*

26. IMS Requirements: Requirement #9 references "Mugshots of the offender(s)". Please describe MPD's current mugshot system and any interface to this system that may be required.

*Answer Q26: The mugshot application, Visage Facial Explorer System, interfaces with the Motorola AFIS-BIS only. Each AFIS LiveScan System, located throughout the district stations, communicates with the AFIS mainframe by downloading all Livescan arrest information. The Image Query enables users to capture, search and retrieve images and biographic information from a facial image database. The Visage Facial Explorer System provides Investigative Browser software that performs one-to-many searches of the entire database for all stored images that closely match the probe image. The system is equipped with Photo Pack software that allows the user to make photo spreads for the Investigator and the witness to view. Numerous types of images can be stored in a case file, including multiple images of faces, tattoos, and scars. Image Query is a Web-based application that can be accessed by using Internet Explorer as the browser.*

27. IMS Requirements: Requirement #10: What is meant by "hidden to the member" in this requirement?

*Answer Q27: "Hidden" means not visible to all users, depending on their role. Not all of MPD's members are familiar with NIBRS or UCR guidelines. Only a select group of members in the districts and Staff Review section are trained in UCR guidelines. MPD has built an offense crosswalk between District of Columbia Criminal Code statutes and the UCR statutes specifically for members that will be classifying these cases. This crosswalk will be made available during the design phase of the project.*

28. IMS Requirements: Requirement #37: This requirement references "other sources" for acquiring mugshots, pictures, and other images". Can we assume these files will be stored on a shared network drive, or should we assume interfaces are required to "other sources"? If interfaces are required, please identify each external system to be interfaced and the desired functionality of the interface.

*Answer Q28: These "other sources" could include documents on a shared network drive, a personal hard drive or via an interface to the AFIS system.*

29. AFR Requirements: Requirement #36: This requirement references "the appropriate forms". Please provide a list of the forms that are required to be completed in the AFR, as well as a sample of each form.

*Answer Q29: See answer to Q20 above.*

30. Does the MPD have a mobile application to be interfaced to the AFR? For example, will there be a requirement to interface the AFR to the Aether mobile application or its replacement? If yes, please provide the interface requirements.

*Answer Q30: The selected vendor will have to create an interface to I/CAD Link to pull the XML report and insert it into AFRS.*

31. The IMS must integrate with standard RMS technology systems.
- Please define the standard RMS technology systems at MPD.
  - Please define the level of integration that is required for each system.

*Answer Q31: See answer to Q21 above.*

32. It is assumed that MPD will want an interface between the existing Mobile application and the new AFRS so that data sent to the mobile application can populate fields on the AFRS forms. To accomplish this, both the Incident Management System and the AFRS System vendor and the mobile vendor will need to provide interface services for their respective products.
- Has MPD allocated funding for the mobile vendor's costs?
  - Does MPD have the mobile vendor interface requirements?
  - Please provide a mobile software vendor name, contact name and phone number.

*Answer Q32a: Yes*

*Answer Q32b: Yes*

*Answer Q32c: There is no need to interface to a mobile application since the AFRS will be linking directly to the Intergraph CAD (see answer to Q30 above too).*

33. MPD currently collects incident report data on forms. Please provide a copy of the forms that MPD will require for the AFRS.

*Answer Q33: See answer to Q20 above.*

34. Can MPD identify existing server hardware and client/work station hardware that is currently being utilized?

*Answer Q34: The specs for our workstations are attached as Appendix 4. The minimum specs for the servers will be Dual Xeon 2.0 Processor, 4 GB Memory, Windows 2003 Server, Minimum Raid 5*

35. Should the vendor quote hardware for this solution?

*Answer Q35: No.*

36. Should vendors propose a fault-tolerant or disaster recovery solution for the solicitation?

*Answer Q36: No.*

37. Can MPD provide workstation network connectivity specifications for the solicitation?

*Answer Q37: Minimum 100bt to workstations w/Gig backbone.*

38. For these interfaces, can MPD provide a point-of-contact for the software provider, a technical contact for MPD, an API or interface specification and a data flow diagram for each interface, e.g. the data will flow to and/or from the proposed system and whether the data flow will be one-direction or bi-directional.

*Answer Q38: See answer to Q21 above. Contact information will be provided after award.*

39. Will Data Conversion such as code table lists be required for this project? If yes, can MPD identify and provide a sample of data that will be converted from legacy systems?

*Answer Q39: Yes, although most of the data conversion will be done as part of the Data Warehouse project. Attached is a sample of a crosswalk we did for the Property fields (Appendix 5).*

40. MPD indicated at the bidder's conference that a Traffic Crash System is currently under development in-house and will require integration into the proposed systems. Can MPD provide technical and interface specifications for this system? Additionally, can MPD provide a data flow diagram and indicate what data will be passed between these systems?

*Answer Q40: Attached is an updated scheme document for the Traffic Crash System (Appendix 6). The relationship between this and the other systems is provided as part of the diagram attached as Appendix 2. It is anticipated that the Traffic Crash System will be merged into the AFRS.*

41. Will MPD extend the due date for responses from vendors to be three weeks after the answers to these questions are posted?

*Answer Q41: That is up to the Office of Contracting and Procurement.*


42. Will MPD provide exact number of client workstations where the software will be installed?




## HIGH-LEVEL VIEW OF OVERALL ARCHITECTURE
